





Every experience is a step in the spiritual path towards realization. In order to use the experience to our own advantage it is but necessary to remove the ego, attachment, pride, anger and other impurities. Loving and living everything that crosses our way, mindfully with the awareness that this is the path to the destination, keeps us encouraged. We can find a constant companion with Swami and the other passengers who are to be your good company in this next step and for us to purposefully be their good company. We cannot play our role and perform our duties to be His able instrument unless we are able to look past what is on the surface and be engaged with what is necessary to be the flute that He can play the Divine melody.

God is Time

Have you been told, or have you said this to anyone? - "Time is precious, be result oriented, be goal oriented, don't waste time, Work smart, not work hard". Swami has given us a number of different contexts to how we must or are spending our time to reflect on. Here are a few...

"You are <u>wasting</u> a lot of time in meaningless pursuits. Time wasted is life wasted. Our ancients never wasted even a minute. They considered God as the embodiment of time and extolled Him thus: Kalaya Namah, Kala Kalaaya Namah, Kalaateetaya Namah, Kalaniyamitaya Namah(Salutations to the Embodiment of Time, to the One who conquered time, to the One who transcends time and to the One who ordains time). Why have you forgotten the truth that time is verily God? You eagerly await a Sunday thinking that you can relax and enjoy. In fact, you should feel sad that you are wasting time without doing any work on a Sunday. You have to utilize your time in a proper way. If you do not have any work, undertake social service. Help your fellowmen. Life becomes meaningful only when you make proper use of time."

"In the world, we are continually experiencing the same round of days and nights. You perform the same ablutions and indulge in the same process of filling the stomach. Thus, you go on from year to year. But what efforts are you making to lead a purposeful and ennobling life? You are going through the same mill of experiences again and again, doing the same things again and again"

"Today man's desire for worldly pleasures has exceeded all limits, and what is more, he wants quick fulfillment of his innumerable desires, by <u>resorting to short cuts</u>. But he must realize that short cuts are always dangerous and riddled with thorns, stones, etc. The highway is always preferable, though it may seem longer. The ways of the Divine are not easy to comprehend."

"Today's man has <u>sraddha</u> no doubt, but only in securing the fruit and not <u>in the labor</u> required for getting it. He does not have the spirit of work in him. The advances in science and technology have made man a lover of comfort for ease with no interest in hard work. There is nothing wrong with science as such. It is the improper use of science that is leading man astray. What is needed today is to pay attention to love and spiritual advancement along with scientific progress."

Divine Analogies

Swami, an inspirational storyteller, has time and again spoken about beauty beyond compare status of 'Prakriti. How do we draw life lessons from Nature around us?

Swami says, 'Nature is the only school that confers on man true wisdom, and God is the only Sadguru'. Treat Nature as the best teacher. In every little act, thought and word, one should discriminate and adopt the best

Analogy: Be like the Ant. When the ant comes across a mixture of sand and sugar, it picks only the sugar and ignores the sand. Other animals however big they are do not possess this ability. See only good in others, pay no attention to the bad. Distinguish between the permanent and the transient, realize what is everlasting. If man realizes the bliss of Divine, he will not yearn for the worldly pleasures.



<u>Insights:</u> Discrimination is an important instrument of spiritual progress. In this path, we must use discrimination to distinguish that which is transient and what is permanent. If there is a strong desire for God, bad thoughts just pass through and will not be held on to.
